














M. A. Bennett S.T.A.G.S.




It seems you can smile even when your heart is breaking . . .

NIGEL MCDOWELL grew up in rural Northern Ireland, and spent most of his childhood battling boredom, looking for adventure, crawling through ditches, climbing trees, devising games to play with his brother and sister, and reading. His favourite book was *The Witches* by Roald Dahl.

The House of Mountfathom was Nigel's final novel. He died in early 2016 at the age of thirty-four. There is a house. Surrounded by a high wall. Behind which magic happens . . .
