

His books have now been translated into twenty-six languages.



Before *Prime Suspect* there was *Tennison*, the story of the iconic detective's early years in the police force, from rookie police officer to fully-fledged detective.

March, 1976. The height of The Troubles. An IRA bombing campaign strikes terror across Britain. Nowhere and no one is safe.

When Detective Constable Jane Tennison survives a terrorist explosion at Covent Garden tube station, she finds herself in the middle of a media storm. She caught sight of the bomber. Too traumatised to identify him, she is nevertheless a key witness and put under 24-hour police protection.

But Jane experiences a sudden flashback. She realises that not only can she identify the bomber, but that the IRA Active Service Unit is very close indeed. She is in real and present danger and hers is not the only life at risk. In a nail-biting race against time, Jane must convince her senior officers to trust her instincts to save London from another deadly assault.

MURDER MILE

February, 1979, 'The Winter of Discontent'. Economic chaos has led to widespread strikes across the country.

Jane Tennison, now a Detective Sergeant, has been posted to Peckham, one of London's toughest areas. As the rubbish on the streets piles up, so does the murder count: two bodies in two days.

There are no suspects and the manner of death is different in each case. The only link between the victims is the location of the bodies. Then there is another murder. Headlines scream that a serial killer is loose on 'Murder Mile' and Jane is under pressure to catch him before he strikes again.
