The magic of DNA

Genes are sections of DNA (short for deoxyribonucleic acid). DNA is made of four chemical bases: adenine (A), guanine (G), cytosine (C) and thymine (T). The way these bases are ordered in the DNA is the code that makes up all life.

Up close, DNA looks a bit like a twisted ladder. Two long strands are held together by bonds between the bases. They wind around each other in a shape called a 'double helix'.

Nearly 3000 years ago, the Romans had a system of numerals that used letters of their alphabet to represent different values, or numbers.

Roman numerals are read from left to right, and the numerals go from big to small. The placement of Roman numerals is important. When there is a smaller numeral to the left of a larger numeral, you subtract the small value from the large one.

IV = 5 - 1 = 4
 IX = 10 - 1 = 9
 XL = 50 - 10 = 40
 CD = 500 - 100 = 400



MCMLIV

M = 1000
 C is smaller than M, so CM = 1000 - 100 = 900
 L = 50
 I is smaller than V, so IV = 5 - 1 = 4
 MCMLIV = 1000 + 900 + 50 + 4 = 1954

This system meant that large numbers could be written without having to repeat symbols over and over again, like the Egyptians had to.
