Her first novel, *Bearmouth*, won the Waterstones Children's Book Prize for Older Readers, and her second novel, *The Twelve*, won the Nero Prize for Children's Fiction.

TOM DE FRESTON is an artist based in Oxford with his wife, Kiran Millwood Hargrave. His practice is dedicated to the construction of multimedia worlds, combining paintings, film and performance into immersive visceral narratives.





But Edith was fourteen once too and knows all too well the pains of growing up. When Billie finds her old diary, she starts to realise just how much they have in common...


