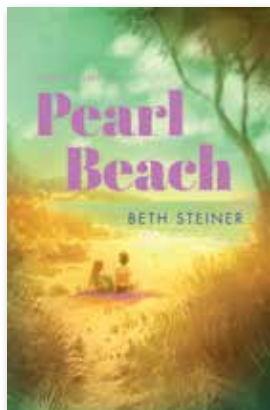

A passionate slam poet, she skilfully weaves poetry into her narratives, bringing a lyrical quality to her storytelling.

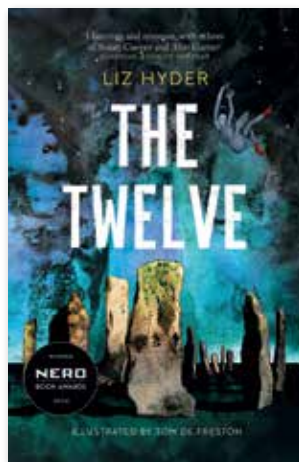
