Life is not a college course

"What you see on your way from one gallery to another is, in fact, way more exciting than what is being exhibited there", Andy Warhol once told a budding art historian. Figuratively speaking, this might also be true of the way between places of faith, between place of work and museum, super market and bookstore. Frank Berzbach likes to look at these in-betweens – by talking to people and keeping his eyes open, by losing himself in music or texts, strolling around and working. In this book he writes about the ways between the "galleries of his life" and in doing so, he contemplates questions to which there are no final answers, i. e. philosophy in its classical meaning. He thinks about life and death, loneliness and life on the road, ordinary experiences and hidden beauty. And time and again, it is about love and its deepest reason – God.

Finding support in life anew

Situations of radical change, be they planned or unforeseen, often turn around our whole life. Whatever the reason – breaking up with a partner, moving, retiring, or the death of a loved one: All of a sudden, nothing is what it was like before. If familiar structures and certitudes disappear, we need to find new "guardrails", create a new daily routine. We need new rituals that offer support and give the day a structure in order for us to feel at home again in our new life. This is the situation sister Carmen Tatschmurat found herself in when she withdrew from her position as abbess in 2021. Suddenly, nothing was what it had been – she had to work out a new daily routine, find rituals and "guardrails" that offered support and orientation and helped structure the day so she could feel at home in her new life. To begin with, she directs our attention to the following questions: how can my way continue – practically, spiritually? What might new opportunities look like? This book provides supportive and often quite practical answers to these and many more questions.

Do you know stripy days?

When asked about the colour of grief, most people probably tend to answer – "black". When asking the mourners themselves, one quickly realizes it can be quite colourful. Moreover each colour represents a certain aspect of this complex feeling which often is so hard to grasp. Anke Keil has traced these colours of grief, and transformed them into touching, practical texts straight from the mourning heart. Apart from that, every colour features a helpful suggestion: a physical exercise, a creative idea, an impulse for writing – whatever fits the given situation. The exercises support and broaden the texts, they are, however, also about resilience as well as discovering and using your own resources that will help you learn to live with the grief.

Splitting up power?

No problem!

Two members of the synodal assembly, the editors Marcus Leitschuh and Sr. Katharina Kluitmann have first-hand experience of the significance of the orders in this process, their constructive contributions as well as the courage and strength they bring about. Many bishops seem to be downright surprised by the calm clarity in which members of the order report on splitting up power, female participation and leadership, all of which have been time-tested. Theologians might have smart answers on the Synodal Path, yet members of the order keep getting to the heart of the subject in a clear, intelligible way.

In this book the members of the order, who significantly help shape the synodal process, have their say, e. g. Sister Franziska Dieterle OSF, Brother Simon Hacker OP, Sister Philippa Rath OSB, Father Bruno Robeck OCist, Sister Bettina Rupp SSpS. Clearly and forward-looking, they write about a Church that deems diversity a strength, whose messages are intelligible to everybody and that is capable of reading the signs of the times.

Marcus Leitschuh is the headmaster of a comprehensive school in the district of Kassel, where he also teaches German and religious education. Furthermore he was an advisor for the commission on youth ministry of the German Bishops' Conference. Marcus Leitschuh has been a member of the Central Committee of German Catholics for 22 years.

As a delegate for representing the laity, he supports their efforts on the Synodal Path. He has hosted events at festival-like gatherings such as Katholikentag and Kirchentag, and people regularly listen to his radio impulses on radio stations such as hr4 and Domradio.



Sister Katharina Kluitmann OSF, PhD, studied psychology at the Pontifical Gregorian University in Rome. original Dutch province. She was chairwoman of the Conference of the leaders of the German orders from 2018 until May 2022 for which she participated in the Synodal Path.

Forever and ever?

On joining the Dominican Order, Joanna Maria Otto meant to stay for good. However, it did not turn out the way she had expected, and eventually became a "monastery retreat". In this book the author tells us about the stages of growing as well as the stumbling blocks on her way that showed her what joining a monastery really means. Yet when she left, she was well aware of the fact that failing with this life plan was just another transition into a new stage of her life; she realized that living in a monastery can be an important chapter in her life in order for her to become who God meant her to be. Apart from that, Joanna Maria Otto makes suggestions as to what a new kind of living in a monastery might look like, what is important and what ought to be renewed or changed in ancient tradition to be taken into the modern age – for many orders, an issue worth considering, especially today when it seems to have become a question of survival.

Hose, Burkhard Betraying the gospel? For a Church that convertes to human rights 144 pages, release September 2022

Human dignity shall be inviolable

The Church raises its voice for complying with human rights on the global stage. On the inside, however, not complying with human rights principles almost seems to be an identity trait in one respect or another. It is no coincidence that the Vatican is one among but a few states which up until today, have not yet signed the International Bill of Human Rights. Apart from this formal kind of support both ecclesiastical daily routine and church structures fall short of complying with the human rights. The abuse crimes, continuous discrimination of the queer and a lack of gender equality in regard to the access to church office point to the current state of affairs. Burkhard Hose is convinced: If the Church does not make up for this deficiency in regard to human rights, it will not be sustainable in the future. When addressing this issue, the author does not do so on a theoretical level, but by linking connecting the experiences he has gained as a passionate advocate of the democratic process within the Church, in favour of gender equality and against exclusion and discrimination, with a biblical perspective on human rights.


